The papaw is a native of tropical and sub-tropical countries but it is widely naturalized or cultivated. A quick growing herbaceous tree up to 20 feet high, with an unbranched trunk near the top of which are clustered the handsome, palmately lobed long-stalked leaves. It is dioecious, that is the male and female flowers are borne on distinct trees, but occasionally a "male" tree produces a fruit. The fruit is produced on the trunk at the base of the leaves of the "female" tree. It is usually melon or gourd-shaped, and measures from 8 to 18 inches long by 4 to 8 inches in diameter. Some particularly good forms produce fruits nearly twice as large as the measurements given above. The fruit is hollow, the cavity being lined with numerous dark seeds, with orange-yellow flesh and is very wholesome. It is eaten like watermelon. It is also prepared as a sweet in various ways. The consumption of this fruit, owing to its wonderful medicinal properties, especially for dyspeptic troubles, is increasing every day.
