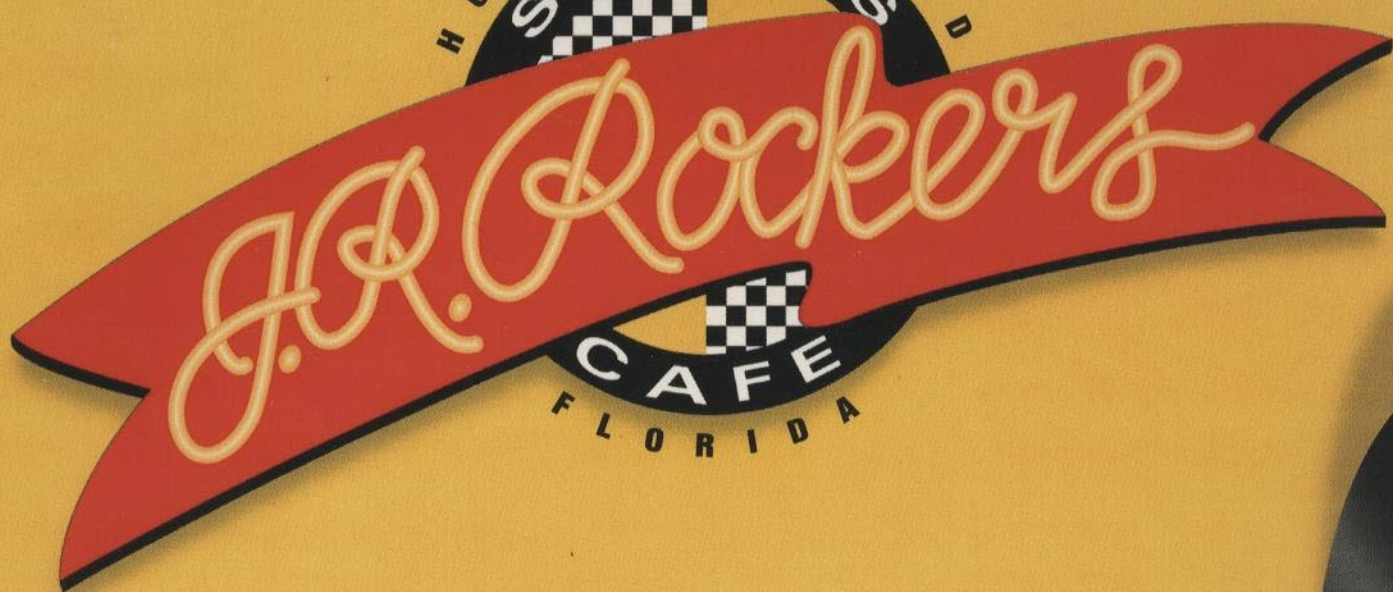

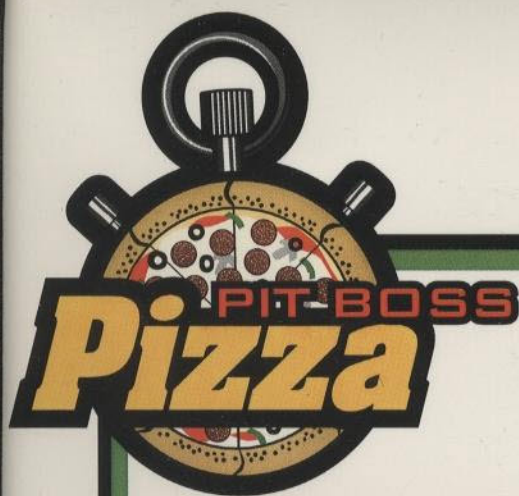

Did You Know?

The first NASCAR Grand National was held at the Charlotte Speedway on June 1, 1949. It attracted a crowd of 13,000 paying spectators, and a field of 33 cars. It was won by Jim Roper.

NASCAR was instigated by William Henry Getty "Bill" France. The incorporation date was February 21, 1948.

1987 was the fastest racing season in NASCAR history. In 1988, the sanctioning body introduced restrictor plates, so it's likely that 1987 will hold that record for all time!

The first NASCAR Grand National/Winston Cup Champion was Red Byron in 1949.

The Daytona International Speedway was constructed by Bill France, and the first race was held on February 22, 1959. Over 40,000 fans crowded in to watch.

Richard Petty (U.S.) and Dale Earnhardt (U.S.) have both won the NASCAR championship a record seven times.

Richard Petty has a record 200 NASCAR Grand National/Winston Cup victories from 1949-1994.

Did you know the Winston Cup Championship used to be called the NASCAR Championship.

Cale Yarborough is the only driver to hold the NASCAR championship title three years running-1976, 1977, 1978.

Dale Earnhardt (U.S.) holds the highest NASCAR career money record of \$27,115,271 (as of July 24, 1996).

The highest single-season earnings record is held by Jeff Gordon, 1995, of \$4,347,343.

The Talladega Superspeedway, constructed by Bill France in 1969, was originally named the Alabama International Motor Speedway.

The largest single driver payday in NASCAR history was in 1993-\$613,000 won by Jeff Gordon.

The oldest NASCAR race winner was Harry Gant in Dover on May 31, 1992—he was 52 years old.

Fred Lorenzen, a 1960's NASCAR hero was known as "The Golden Boy".

The Purlator 500 in March and the Napa 500 in October are both hosted in Atlanta. The track, built in 1960, is 1,522 miles long with 24° banks.

Richard Petty, as of 12/12/96, has the greatest average of wins to races—winning 1 out of every 5.3 races entered. In close second is David Pearson with 1 out of every 5.4.

Veteran NASCAR driver Darrell Waltrip's last win was at the '92 Mountain Dew Southern 500; it was his 84th career win.

Donnie Allison is the only rookie driver to win the NASCAR Award (1967), and the Indy Rookie Crown (1970).

Jeff Gordon holds the Winston Cup record for the most money won by a rookie—his Rainbow Warrior team won over \$765,000 in 1993.

Richard Petty is known as "The King" of stock car racing.

Most money won by a Rookie in a single season was Jeff Gordon, 1993, with \$765,168.

In 1979, the Daytona 500 became the first 500 mile race in history to be telecast live in its entirety.

Richard Petty and Cale Yarborough are the only drivers to win the Daytona 500 in three different decades.

The Dura Lube 500 is held in Phoenix.
