

Nearly all communities boast such a place; an eatery – centrally located and unpretentious – serving as a second home and assembly for young and old.

In Olympia, the undisputed establishment is the legendary Spar Cafe & Bar designed by the famed architect Joseph Wholeb, the downtown restaurant that has catered to the area's working class since it replaced the notorious Oxford Brother's Saloon in 1935.

There have been many changes over the years. In the 30's it was more of a tavern than a cafe, offering only beer and wine in the rear of the cafe. Four pool tables and a cardroom kept the playful busy in the section that is now occupied by the Highclimber Room offering liquor by the drink – established in 1949.

In the 30's and 40's plywood millworkers and longshoremen kept the place jumping night and day – they came to cash their payroll checks, to play poker, pan, pool, punchboards, sports pools, and to place bets on their favorite sporting events, and to check their results on the Western Union tickertape, removed by the U.S. Treasury Department in 1962.

After the 1950's, state workers, shoppers and merchants replaced the blue collar workers who moved when the mills closed.

In the 1970's and today, college students, state workers, businessmen, attorneys, financiers, politicians, retirees, and just plain folks from all walks of life have become patrons of the Spar. Most evocative of old times are the Darius Kinsey black and white photographs of loggers' exploits, including the one that gave the cafe its name: stripping the branches from a giant evergreen so that the denuded trunk, called a spar, could be rigged with cables, pulleys and steam donkeys and used as a workbase.

And it is with pride and commitment that the Spar Cafe & Bar maintains its authentic link to Olympia's past.
