Scotch List

Balvenie

Balvenie 10 Year Old

Nose: Orange-honey perfume. Musky, faint bint of peat.

Palate: Honeyed sweetness drying to lightly spicy notes. Very lively. Just a bint of sherry.

Finish: A tingly, almost aggressive, surge of flavours, with lingering, syrupy boney.

Balvenie 15 Year Old
Nose: Cedary. Vanilla. Custard. Honey.
Palate: Toffee. Sweetish. Cedary. Scenty
Finish: Coconut. Indian spices. Very long indeed.

Glenfiddich 12 Year Old

Nose: Light and malty/mealy. Water opens up the nutty crackerbread maltiness alongside some dry grass and dried apple.

Palate: Soft with vanilla, malt, a light nuttiness and a soft mid-palate.

Finish: Soft and lightly fruity with a hint of chocolate.

Glengoyne 10 Year Old

Nose: Sweet, with toffee and popcorn aromas.
Slightly nutty, with fresh green apples coming through
Palate: Clean. Green apples and grass with a hint of sweet liquorice
Finish: Sweet and malty

Lagavulin 16 Year Old

Nose: Massive peat. Ultra-intense iodine carries a shade more spice than of old. The fruity-sherry notes are clean, vanilla is much deeper.

Beautifully layered.

Palate: Peat so thick you could stand a spoon in it. Chewy iodine bolstered by sherry and big oak. Finish: A little spice lightens the grip of the peat and vanilla. Dries off with malt, dried dates... and iodine.

Glenlivet

Glenlivet 12 Year Old

\$9

Nose: Floral and malty. Ivy. Sweet cereals. Fresh paint. Cedar. Polished floors. A touch of marzipan. Apples in puff pastry. Buttery. Palate: Fresh and minty. Quite chewy. Spices emerge but not excessively so. A splash of water brings out flavours.
Finish: Satisfying, warm and spicy.

Glenlivet 15 Year Old, French Oak \$12

Nose: Incense. Lightly oily (wood oil), russet apples and buttery notes. Some pineapple and then floral notes.

Palate: Medium bodied. Light cinnamon spiciness, then apple and a sparkling feel.

Finish: Fades, leaving a slightly bitter note.

Glenlivet 18 Year Old \$15

Nose: Elements beautifully combined. Depth of flowery aromas. Very light touch of peatiness. Some sweetness and a hint of sherryish oak.. Palate: Flowery and sweet at first, then developing peach-stone nuttiness. Finish: Dry appetizing. Very long, with interplay of sweet and bitter flavours.

Glenlivet Archive, 21 Years \$24

Nose: Very fresh in both its heathery peatiness and its juicy, sweet, sherry. Appetising. Palate: Sweet, flowery, honey-syrup, butter, toast and butter.

Finish:Cinnamon. Lightly spicy dryness. Well-done toast. Gently sustaining.

Glenmorangie 10 Year Old \$11

Nose: Walnuts. Vanilla. Green herbs. Some flowery sweetness.

Palate: Flaky oakiness with a complex toastiness to the barley suggesting the lightest hint of smoke.

Finish: Amazingly long, drying from the initial sweetness but with flaked almonds amid the oakier notes.

Glenrothes Select Reserve

Nose: Spice, spirit and citrus. Fruitiness too, with a combination of pale sultanas and sharp woodland berries.

Palate: Slightly spirity, spicy and with mixed peel character.

Finish: Dry cereal, nutty, young.

Glenrothes Vintage 1991

Nose: Soft, fruity, ripe black plums and liquorice. Palate: Soft citrus, orange zest and sherry oak. Finish: Medium length, spicy.

Glenrothes Vintage 1987

\$16

Nose: Charming acacia honey and demerara sugar within a floral theme of pansies and violets.

Palate: Initially enclosed and oaky. Pans out to allow a richer, toffee-cream and intensely malty

middle. Finish: Medium length, simple mixture of oak and barley.

Glenrothes Vintage 1984

Nose: Full, fruity, ripe melon, vanilla oak. Palate: Full, spicy, oak and vanilla. Finish: Medium length and sweetness.

Glenrothes Vintage 1972

\$30

Nose: Extraordinary malt concentrate tempered with intense vanilla. Brooding and fabulously balanced.
Palate: A curious but enormously delicious amalgam of rich barley, toffee and liquorice.

Extremely sweet throughout.
Finish: Long, melt-in-the-mouth, with a hint of honeycomb and countering spice.

Nose: Nutty (hazelnut) with dry bracken/heather and cereal. Water brings out grassiness, a touch of syrup and green fern. Palate: Soft to start. Rounded with butterscotch and nutmeg. Light, dry.
Finish: Sweet. Expressive. Orange flower water

Nose: Very aromatic, indeed. Sexily earthy. Peaty, junipery, fruity. Palate: Robust malt and grain. Very lively. Scenty spiciness. Gingery. Comes on hot and strong.
Finish: Island smokiness and saltiness emerging; lingering and insistent.

Nose: Rich. Maple syrup, spices and mustard. Palate: Cannabis. Big interplay of smoky dryness, spicy heat and sweetly malty, creamy vanilla.

Finish: Rounded with raising sherry. At length, mellow.

Nose: Fragrant, inspired. Mango and guava.
Beeswax. Toffee. Peppercorn. A whiff of
sea-breeze.
Palate: Smooth, mellow. Honeyish. Then sailing
off with dainty sea flavours. Cinnamon and
coffee fudge. Toasted almond.
Finish: Spicy, long, warming. Walnut stain. An
echo of peat smoke.

Nose: Perfumy. Lime skins. Juniper. Slightly sweet spiciness. Tobacco and juicy oak. Palate: Beautifully rounded. Voluptuous. Ginger cake. Marzipan. Nuts. Pears in chocolate. Finish: Flowery dryness. roses. Long, lingering.

<u>ITALY</u> Bartenura

Named for a 15th century philosopher,
Bartenura wines are currently one of the
hottest wines from Italy. The winery located in
the Piedmont region of Italy, these premium
Italian wines will offer you a unique insight
into the marvelous wine traditions of Italy. The
vineyard planted on Pavia's sun-drenched
landscape tends to yield rich, ripe grapes that
produce aromatic, fruity wines. With a broad
range of outstanding varietals, Bartenura is a
firm presence on the Italian wine market.

Light, dry and crisp, with tangy
lemon-grapefruit aromas and flavors.

Chianti 10 37 Tuscany

Tuscan; 2004

Oak aged, fruity bouquet of cherries and fresh red fruit, entwined with spicy, peppery notes. This wine is lively and fresh on the palate, with soft, rounded tannins followed by a long finish.

Moscato D'Asti 7 24 Castelboglione 2005

Naturally rich in perfumes, the production of this wine is geared towards preserving these aromas in the finished wine. Fermentation takes place at a low temperature in order to give this wine fresh, peachy perfumes and a light, grapey fruit.

Prosecco 7 25 Castelboglione

2005

This sparkling white wine has apple and vanilla aromas. Fresh apple, pear, and cinnamon flavors. Easygoing with a slight rich and creamy finish.

AUSTRALIA Teal Lake

When wine production began in Australia during the early 1800's the wines produced were rich and sweet, typical of a warm climate, and for the most part, just used locally. However, using modern technology, Australia began to produce popular table wines that rivaled the wines in the west. Currently Australia is the third largest exporter of wine to the U.S., behind only France and Italy.

Shiraz 9 36

South Eastern Australia 2005

Vibrant red in colour with very purple hues. This premium Australian Shiraz shows an intense spicy, fragrant bouquet together with stylish elegant berry fruit flavours on the palate.

Petit Verdot Cabernet 7 28 South Eastern Australia

2003

55% Petit Verdot, 45% Cabernet. Deep purple hues with lifted perfumed spices and mint on the nose. The palate displays rich plum fruit flavours combined with spice and mint and balanced with a subtle hint of French oak to finish with a firm tannin grip.

Altoona Hills

Located in central Victoria, not far from Nagambie and Seymour, Altoona Hills is an extremely approachable selection of Australian wines that appeal to beginner wine drinkers, as well as advanced palates.

Rich fruit flavors, shows considerable complexity. The bouquet displays of melon and peaches while providing a creamy texture that lingers at the finish.

Baron Edmond de Rothschild planted the first vineyards near Rishon le Zion, south east of Jaffa/Tel-Aviv. In 1882, French rootstock was brought in, and the Baron sent his own specialists to advise the pioneers and to start the building of large wine cellars in Rishon le Zion. Exporting to over 40 countries, Carmel products are now to be found in leading wine stores and retail chains around the globe.

CALIFORNIA Weinstock Cellars

The winemaker, Peter Stern who also supervises the making of Baron Herzog wines — produces a full line of premium varietals.

Hagafen Cellars is located in the Napa Valley, in the heart of California's premier wine grape region. Owned and operated by Irit and Ernie Weir, the winery was founded in 1979. The first vintage released commercially was harvested in 1980. Hagafen Cellars currently produces 8,000 cases of premium table wines each year.
