



for 28 days.




Creating an even better learning experience for JWU students ...

Johnson & Wales University's 12th Annual Cassola Conference was held on April 3, 2009. This year's topic was "Exploring New Worlds: Teaching Communication in the 21st Century." **Instruction librarian Ariela McCaffrey** presented with members of the Collaborative Learning Program (CLP) on the topic of "Teaching Writing through Integrated Learning." The CLP is a cross-disciplinary approach to teaching and learning that includes faculty and staff from the Colleges of Hospitality, Business, and Arts & Sciences as well as the Community Service Learning Center and the University Library. Business students who are enrolled in this program participate in research projects, community service opportunities, and real-world business activities.





You're invited ...


E-BOOKS 24/7
