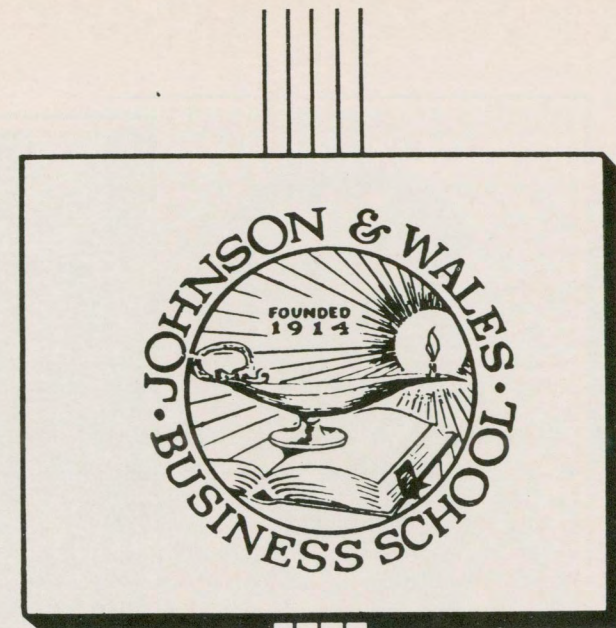

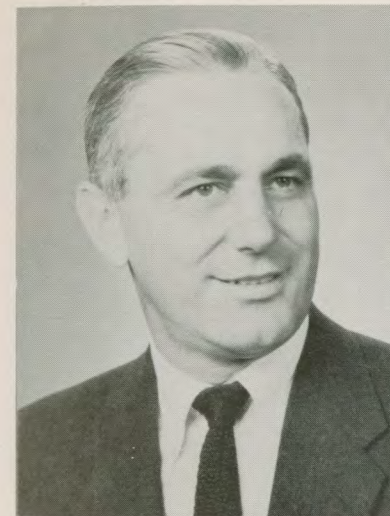
To the Class of 1957, may we, in addition to wishing the usual "best of luck, Godspeed, etc." say we are pleased and proud to have you in our family of alumni.
