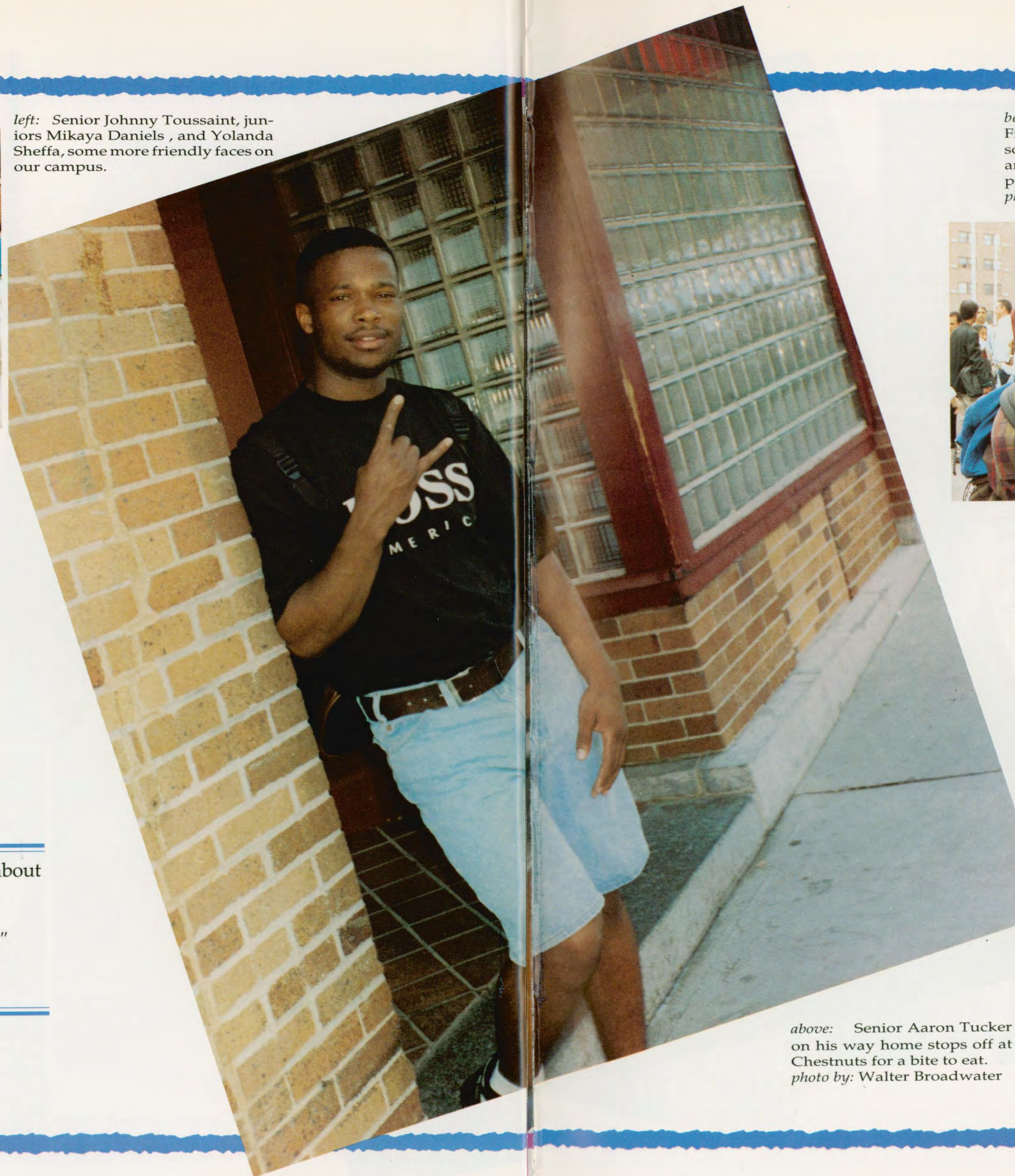

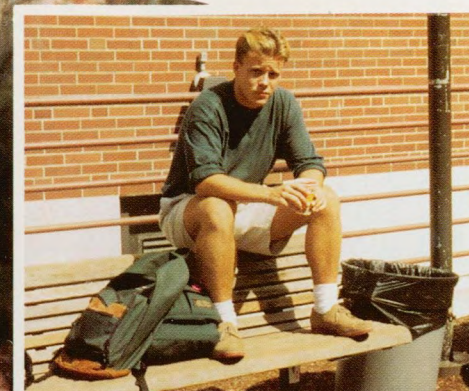

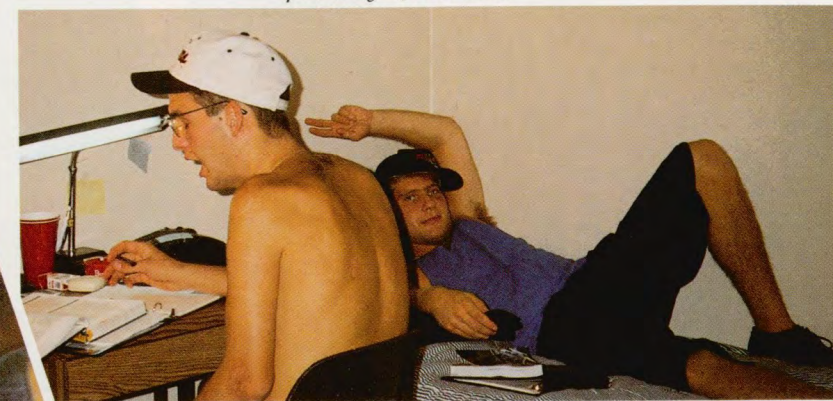

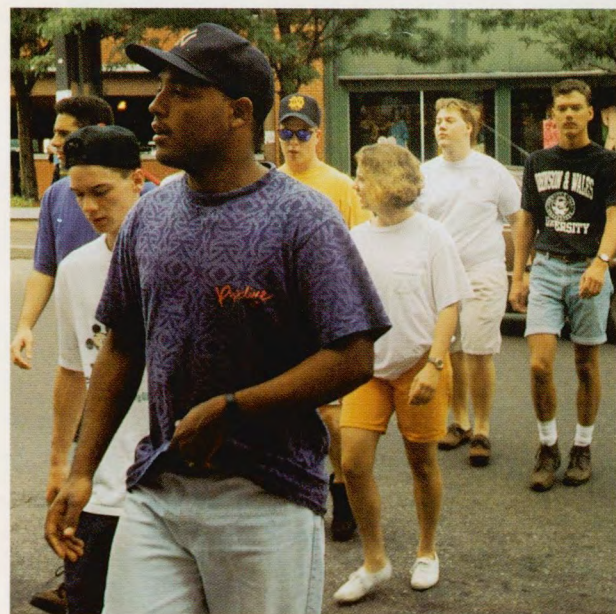

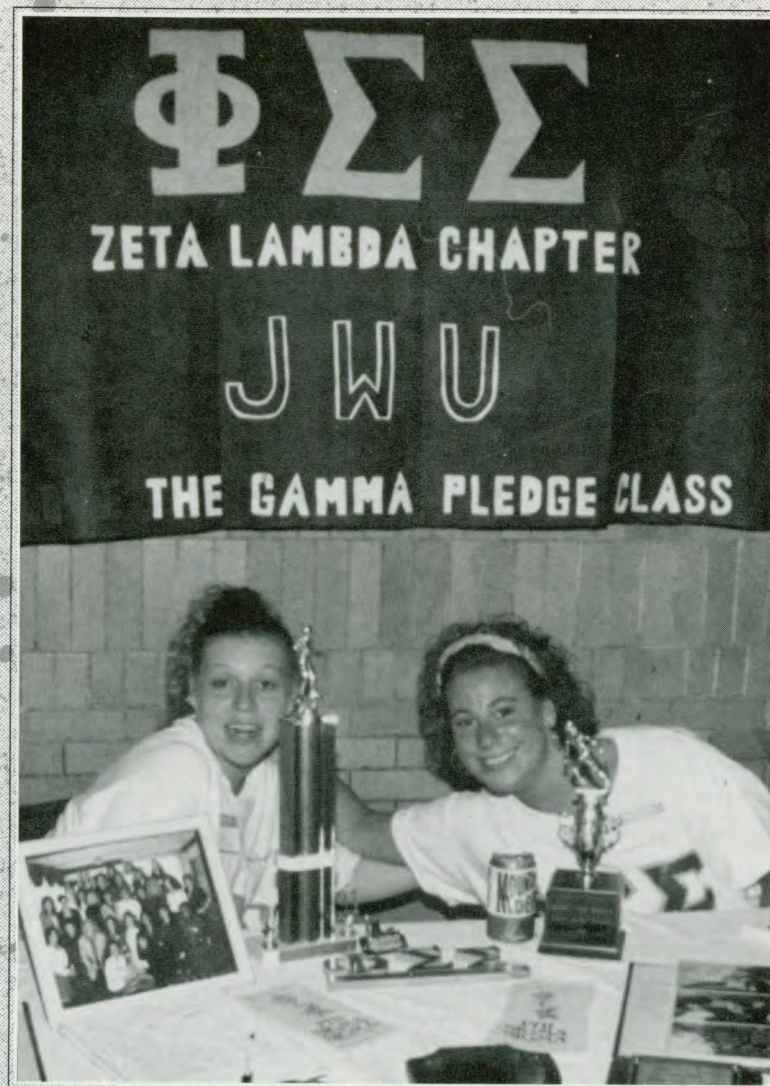

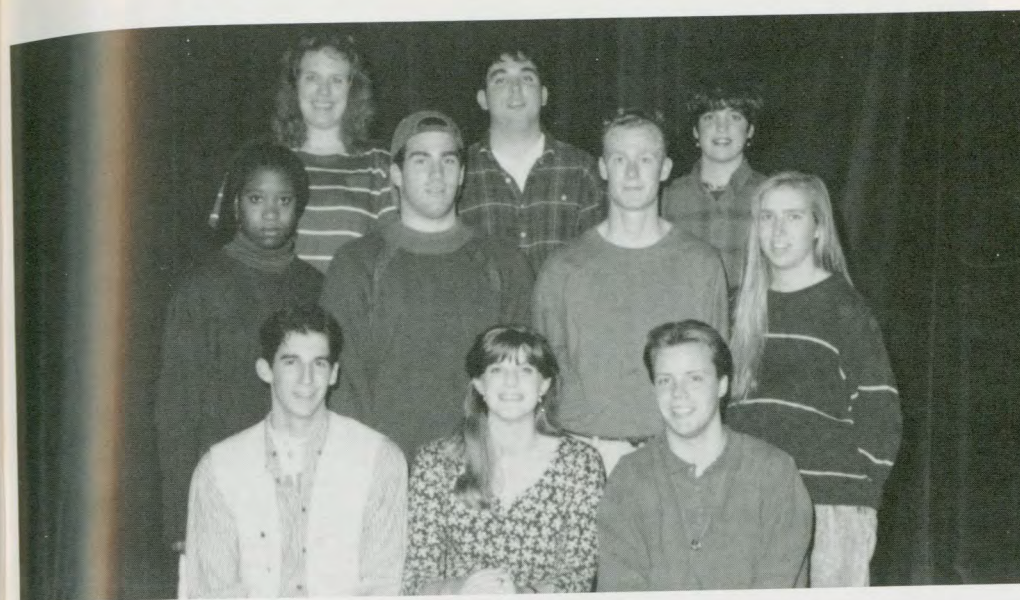

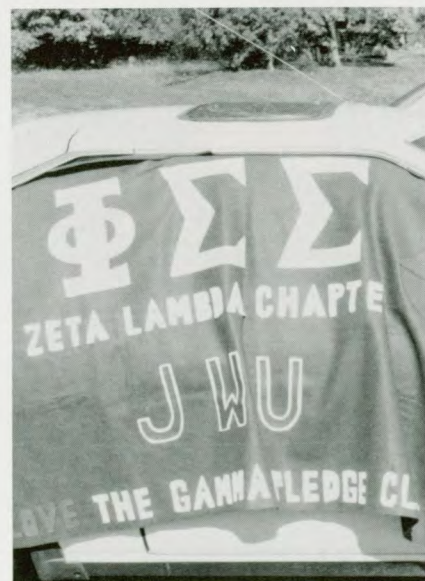

Newport is one of the biggest draws for tourists in Providence. People travel to see yachting, the mansions, go to the beach, the Jazz Festival, and the fresh seafood.

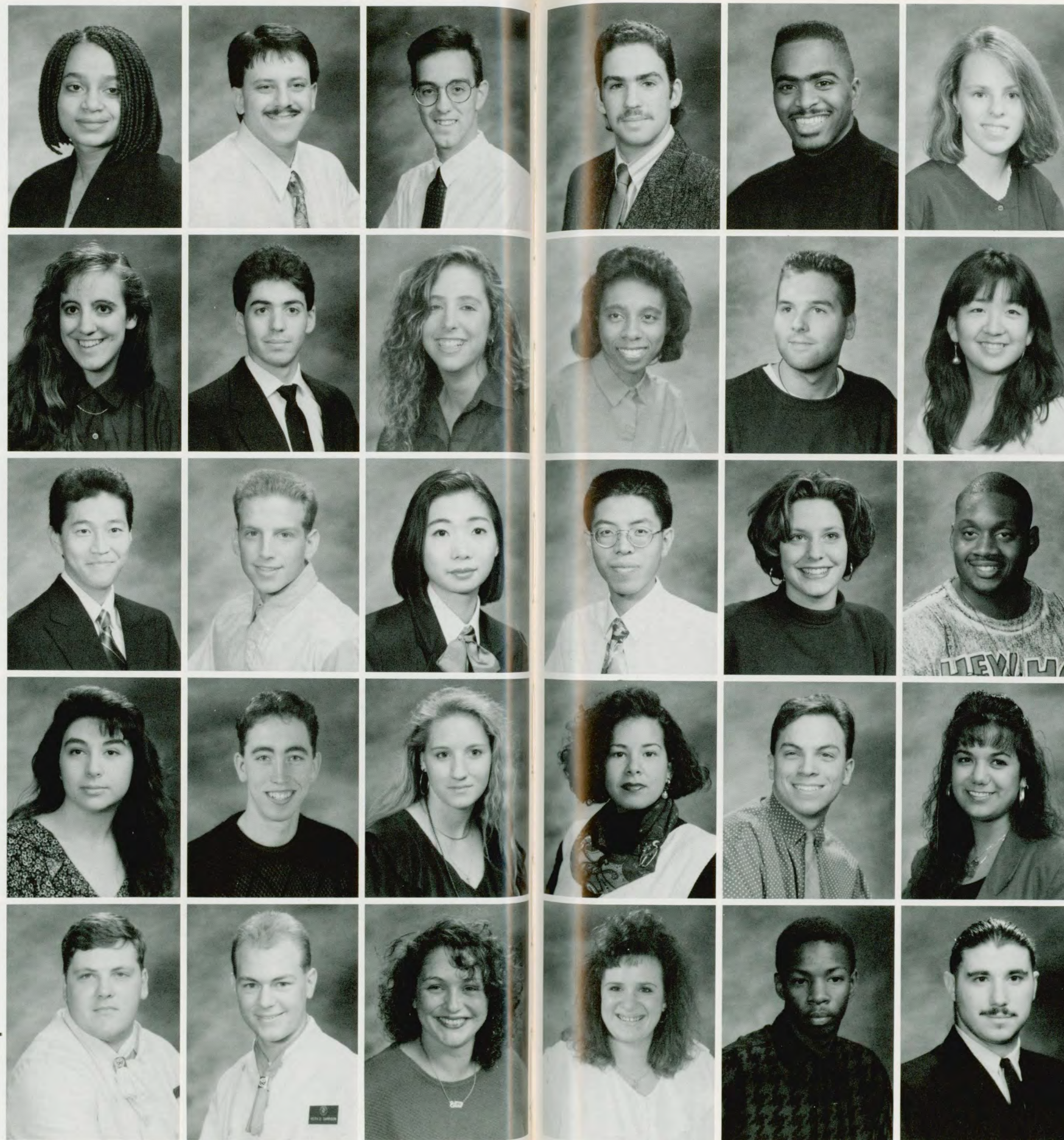

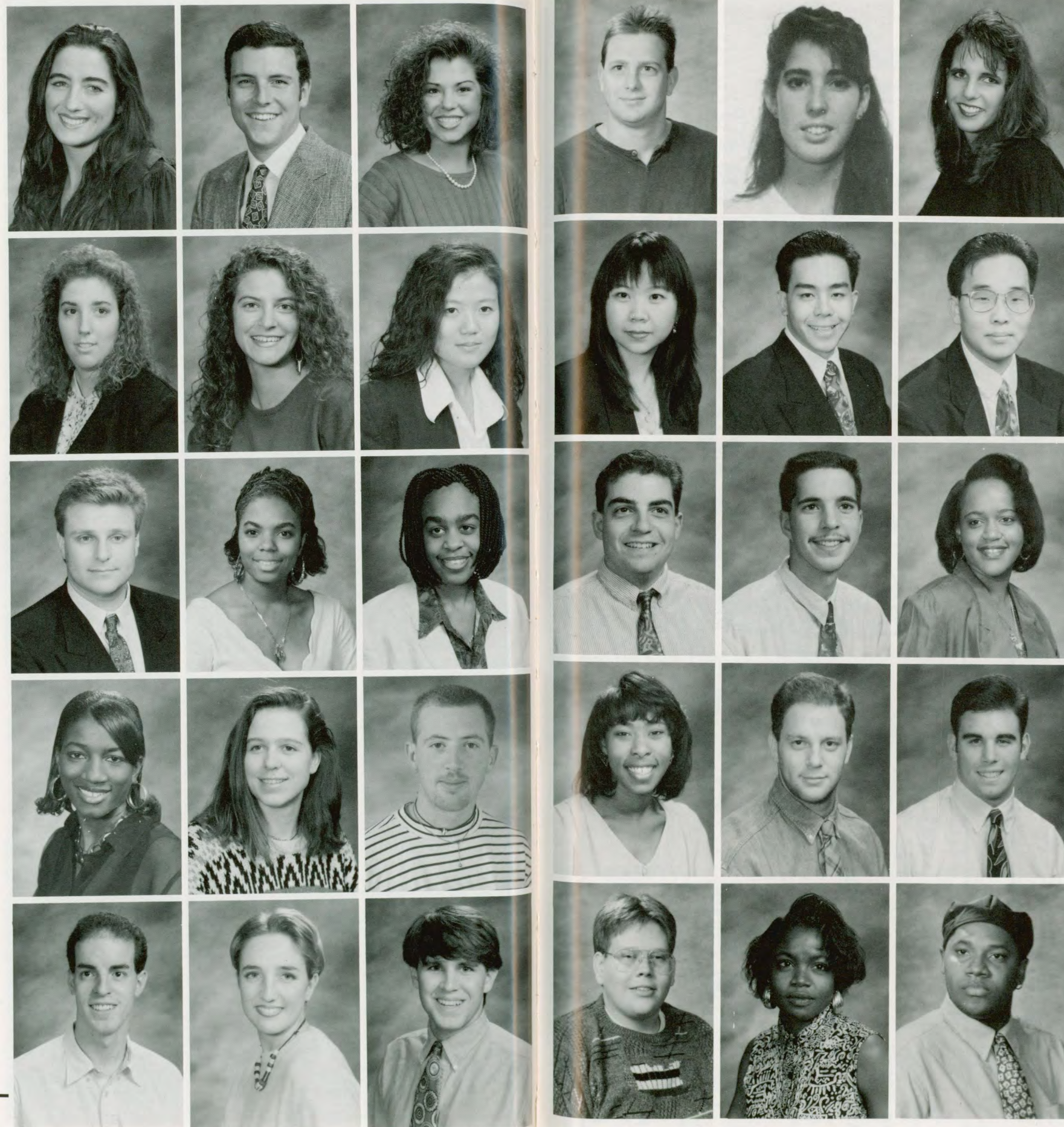
Where's the Apple?

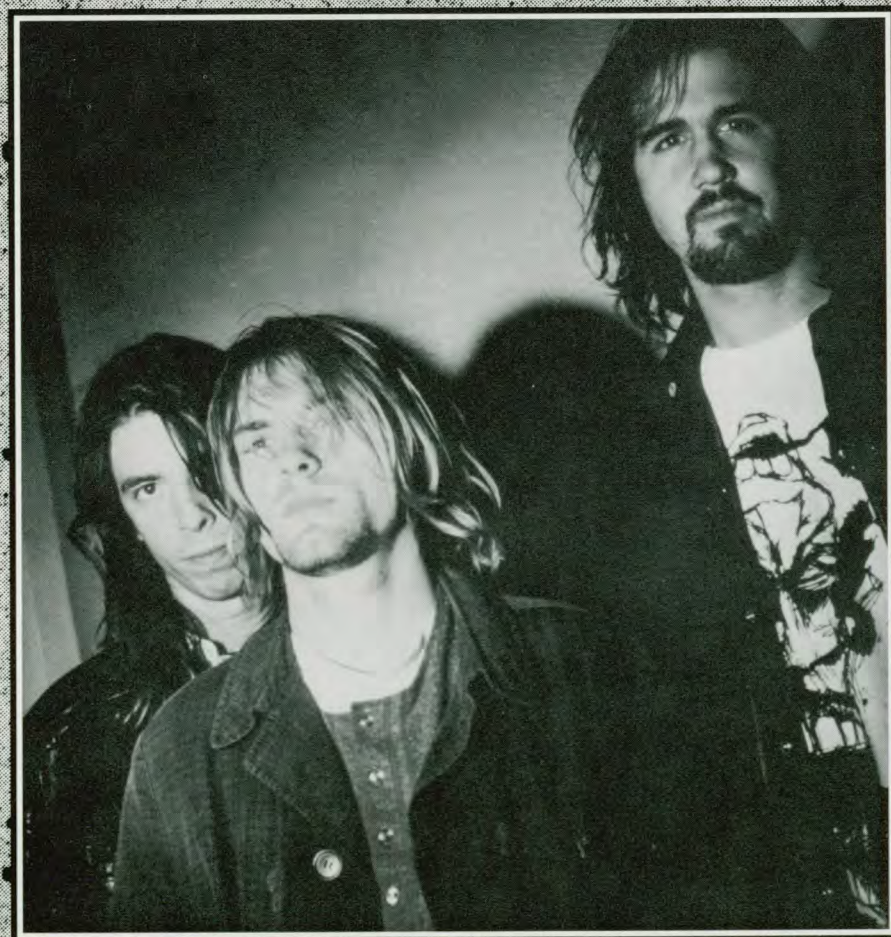

right: Bosnian President Alijah Izenbegovic says he is disillusioned about the world's willingness to take action to end bloodshed in his country. Bosnia Serbs have been fighting for their own state. The percent of Bosnia--voted earlier this year to secede from Yugoslavia. Izetbegovic heads a seven-member presidency, comprised of two Muslims, two Croats, two Servs and one representative of other minorities, such as Hungarians and Jews. *below:* Mohamed Farrah Aidid, the feared warlord in the devastated country of Somalia, eluded United Nations military forces for months. A US-led multinational force arrived in the war-torn country last year to help feed starvation population and bring peace to country that was run by warlords. Aidid was considered the most powerful of the warlords and was blamed for numerous attacks on the military. The power struggling Somalia left tens of thousands dead and allowed the country to be carved into a collection of clan fiefdoms in the absence of a central government. More than 350,000 Somalis died from fighting and famine. *below right:* In September the Bosnia parliament rejected an international peace plan for that devastated republic. The move, postponed a settlement that would have ended the 10 month old war that has partitioned the country into three ethnic states for Croats, Muslims and Serbs. The United Nations has sent a peace keeping force to the former Yugoslavia to help keep peace amount the three waring factions. Tens of thousands of people have been killed in the conflict and more than a million have been left homeless.



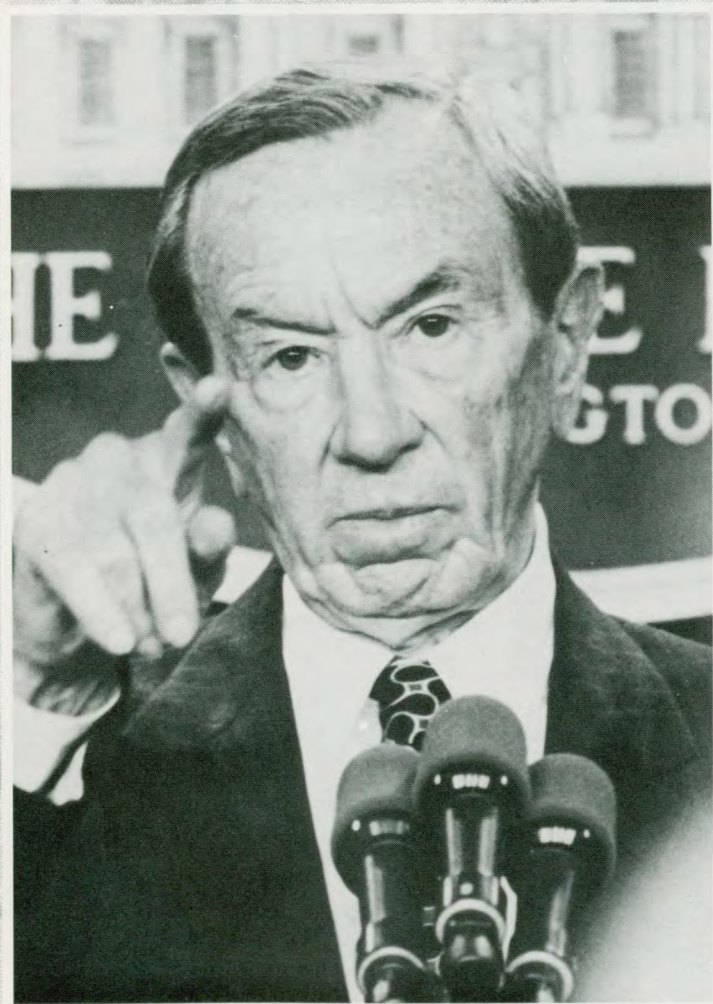
top: The people of Haiti anxiously awaited the return of their elected president the Reverend Jean Bertrand Aristide. After two years of exile that followed an army coup that over threw him, President Aristide was set to return home. Aristide, a Roman Catholic priest was elected in a landslide in the country's first democratic vote. His return followed two years of negotiating a settlement Haiti's political crisis. *above:* Sheik Omar Abdel-Rahman was the accused leader of a group of terrorists that exploded a bomb in the World Trade Center. More than 1,000 were injured and 6 died. The 55 year old Egyptian sheik had been linked to dozens of terrorist plots around the country, including plots to bomb other New York City buildings, the United Nations and Lincoln and Holland tunnels.



below: Pope John Paul II visited the United States for the third time since becoming Pope 15 years ago. The 72 year old pontiff attended World Youth Day, a week long pilgrimage that brought nearly 200,000 youths form around the world to Denver. President Clinton and Vice President Gore traveled to Colorado to meet with the Pope.

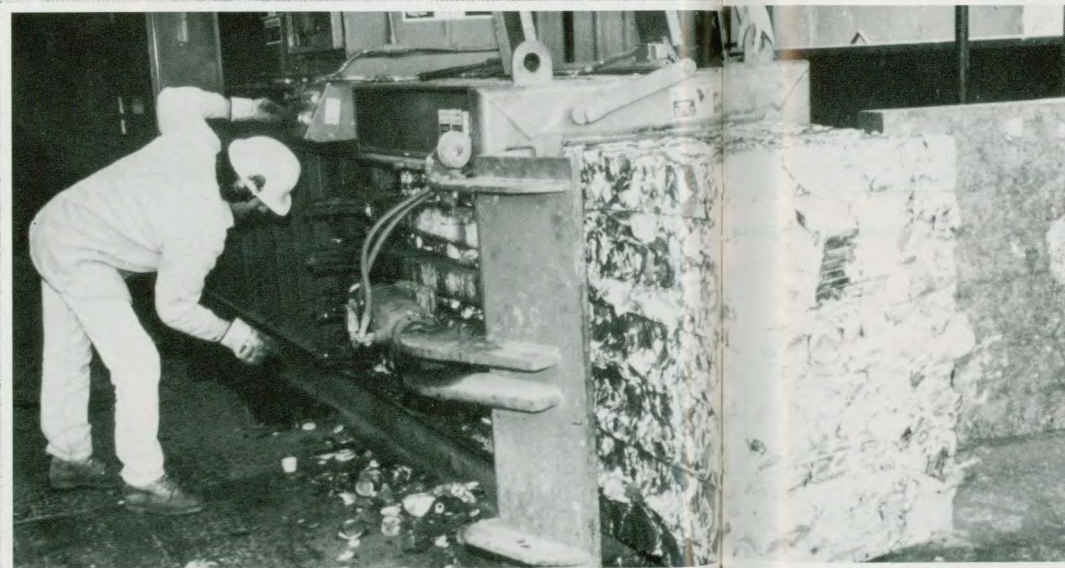

below: Helping to keep the environment clean became an important goal and a corporate mandate for many companies. Johnson & Johnson, McDonald's Corp. and leading users of paper-based products took an unprecedented environmental initiative and joined together to boost their use of recycled paper. Working with the Environmental Defense Fund, the companies will help devise ways to increase their use of recycled paper and encourage their suppliers to use more environmentally sound methods to make paper products.



left: Lumberjacks clashed with environmentalists in the Northwest part of the country over the fate of some of the nation's oldest forests. President Clinton tried to bring the two sides together to agree on the future of the region's old-growth forests, which have provided both timber for the logging industry and homes to the threatened spotted owl and other species.

right: Ross Perot, the Texas computer tycoon and erstwhile presidential candidate, keeps his public image alive after he lost his presidential bid. Perot won 19 percent of the vote in the 1992 presidential election in a historic independent presidential candidacy. He has repeatedly said he has no plans to run again in 1996, but the multimillionaire keeps an extensive travel schedule.

below left and right: Floods hit the Midwest in late spring and early summer--thousands of farms and homes were lost, fields were swamped and towns were submerged. The states that got hit the hardest were Iowa, Illinois and Missouri, causing billions of dollars worth of damage. As the waters began to recede, barges began moving along the Mississippi River and people began digging out their mud-filled homes. President Clinton signed a \$5.7 million aid package to help the victims.



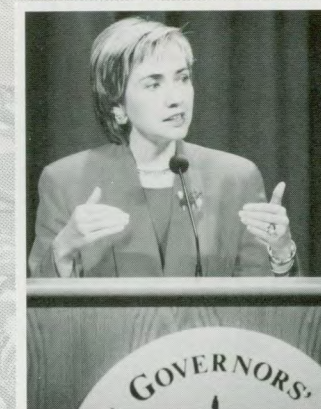
Nature At Its Worst

The proposal calls for employers to pay 80 percent of their workers' average health-care premiums and workers would pay the rest. Small businesses and low-wage workers would get subsidies to help them pay their share. The plan would cost the federal government an extra \$350 billion over five years, and Clinton hopes to get most of that money from holding down spending in Medicaid and Medicare, boosting cigarette taxes by about 80 cents a pack and imposing a special levy on corporations that set up their own health plans.

right: Janet Reno is the first women attorney general of the United States. As the nation's head crime fighter, she confronts growing problems--drugs, gangs, violence. The 55 year old prosecutor--a self-described "awkward old maid"--has become a crusader for America's children. Reno's save the family campaign is one of her many projects.



left: Ruth Bader Ginsburg became the second female supreme Court Justice. She joins Sandra Day O'Connor, a justice since 1981. Ginsburg, 60, is the 107th high court justice. She had won several landmark Supreme Court cases as a lawyer for the American Civil Liberties Union Women's Rights Project in the 1970s. She was the prime architect to the then-radical legal argument that the Constitution most often required equal treatment for men and women.

The Johnsonian, the Yearbook of Johnson & Wales University is a spring production yearbook produced annually by a volunteer staff of students. *The Johnsonian* office is located at the Friendship Building, Office of Student Publications, 2 Richmond Street, Providence, Rhode Island, 02903. Telephone number (401) 455-2804, Fax number (401)456-1171.

Volume 44 of *The Johnsonian* was printed by Walsworth Publishing Company, 306 North Kansas Avenue, Marceline, Missouri 64658. Our Walsworth representative was David M. Roth and our Customer Service Consultant was Donna K. Bell. *The Johnsonian* has a press run of 2,500 copies. Funding was furnished by JWU.

The 1994 Johnsonian is a full 14 signatures, with 208 numbered pages and 16 pages of Mini-Mag, equalling 224 pages. The cover is custom designed, embossed, navy and eggshell leather. Number One Grade Signature Gloss paper was used in all four color pages and black and white pages, except in Mini-Mag where 80# Regency Embossed. Out of 224 pages, 24 were printed using the four color process, eight pages were printed using spot color, and the remaining 184 pages were black and white. Tru-Black high gloss commercial inks were used.

Layouts and Designs were created on Aldus PageMaker by *The Johnsonian* staff on four Macintosh computers provided by the Office of Student Publications which was also shared by The Campus Herald, JWU student run newspaper. Templates from Walsworth Publishing were used for pages 2-15 and pages 206-207. All layouts, including all copy, were submitted on disk to the plant in Missouri. All color separation and final output was provided by Walsworth Publishing Company.

The advertisements on pages 198-205, were the works of Wayne E. Sutton of College Publications, 655 Jefferson Boulevard, Warwick, Rhode Island 02886. Photography for graduate photos and clubs and organizations group photos were taken by McGrath Studio, 1 Perkins Avenue, Brockton, MA 02401. Our representative are Bob and Jack McGrath. Photographs in the year in review section was provided by RM Associates, P.O. Box 452, New York, NY 10150. Remaining photographs were taken by staff members except on pages 120-121 and page 208. These photos were taken by Constance Brown.

Many type styles were used throughout the book, stories were mainly in 10 point Palatino, captions in 8 point Palatino. All photo credits were in 8 point Palatino italic. Bookman, Palatino, Symbol, Helvetica, Times, Coronet and Geneva were used in various sections of the book.
