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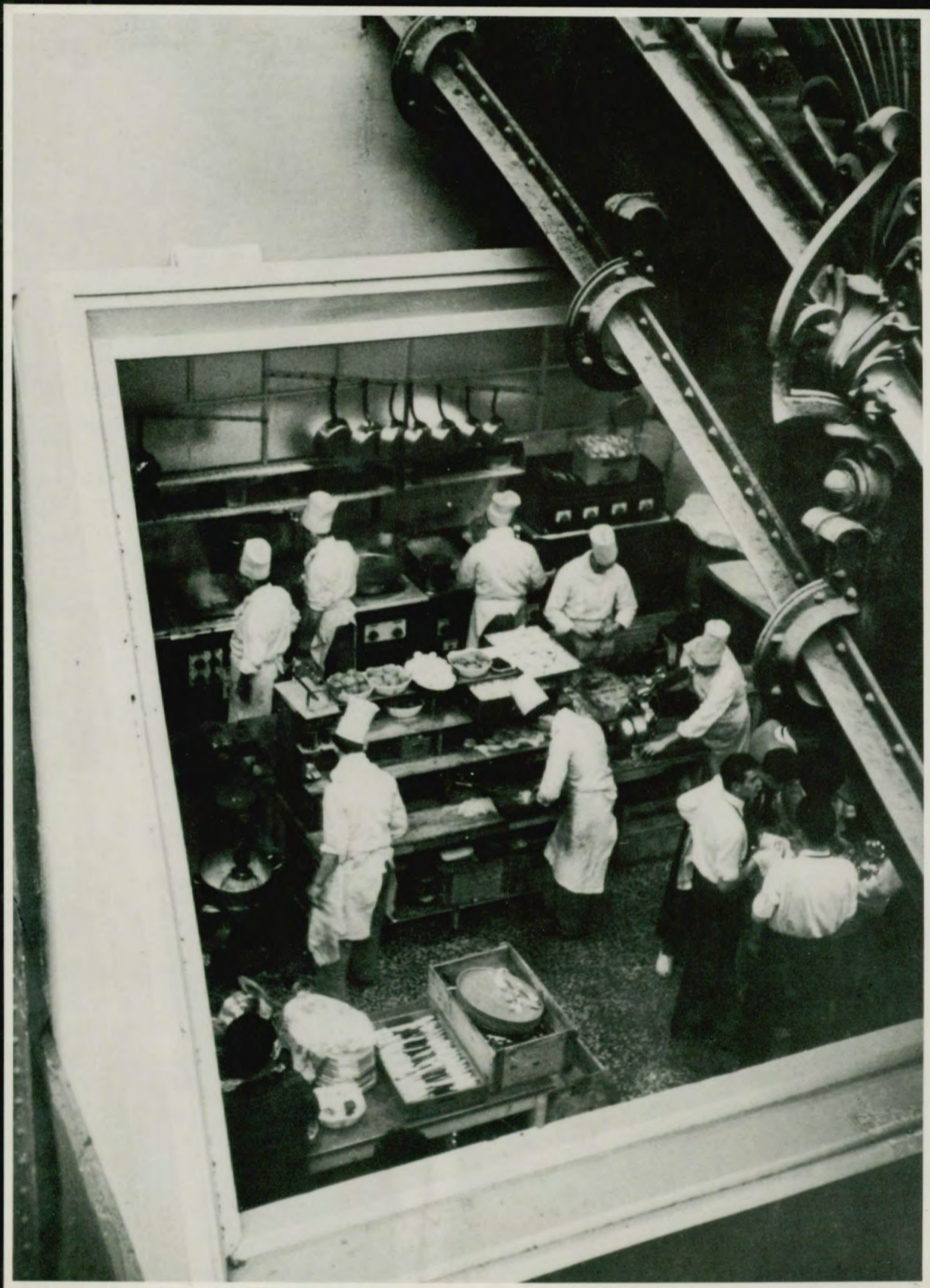


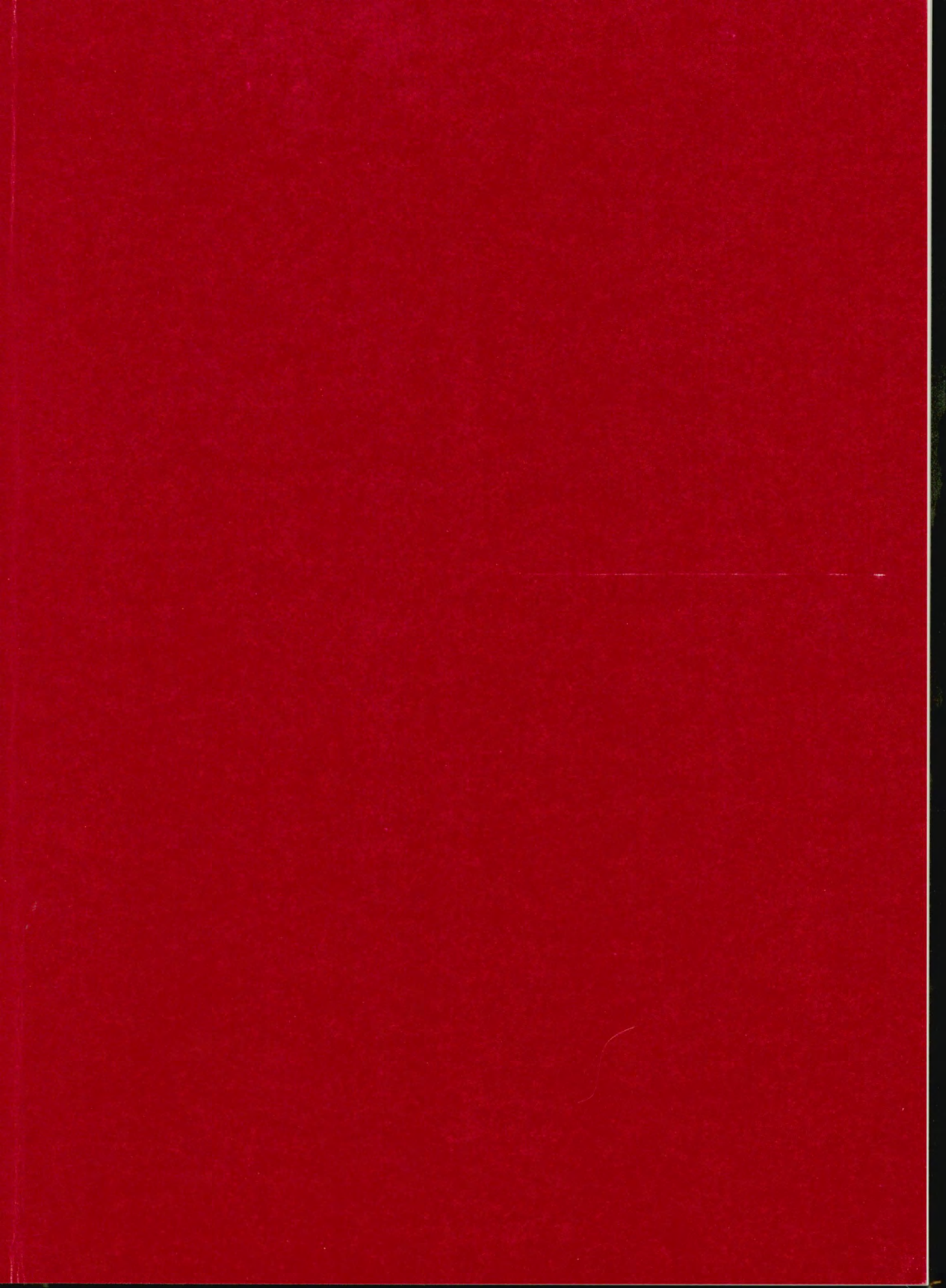
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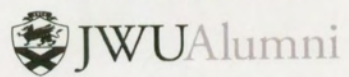

The 1993/1994 school year has brought yet another year of growth and change to the Norfolk campus. The sounds of hammers and saws have truly become the "sounds of summer" at Johnson & Wales University. Last summer's renovations produced an expanded and updated dining room, several classrooms, and relocated the Student Services Department in closer proximity to the student body. Plans for the upcoming summer are already well underway and include the construction of the IFSEA Student Union. 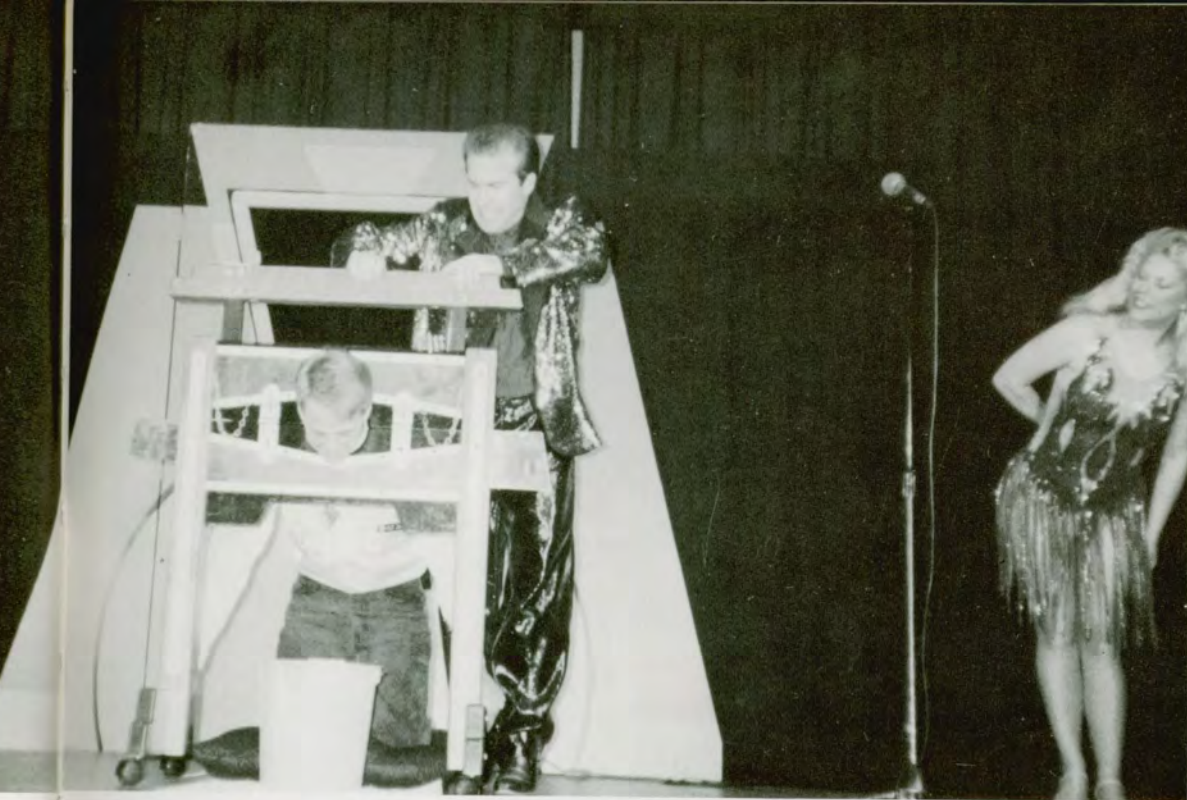
