THE CALLER

Music and the square dance stand high amongst the simple pleasures enjoyed by the French Canadian — and every party has its “caller.” At the Saturday night “veillée,”¹ and on such occasions as “fiancailles,”² weddings or anniversaries, his “swing her high . . . swing her low . . . let the ladies through . . . hop right in and hop right out again . . . promenade a quatre” ring out in his own style. An artist himself, he captures the spirit of the evening and backed by his fiddler, accordion player or joueur de “piano a gause,” he carries his audience through the intricate movements of the “quadrille,”³ speeding up to a ringing crescendo which leaves all happy and exhausted.
