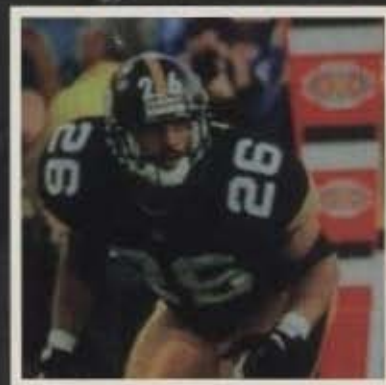

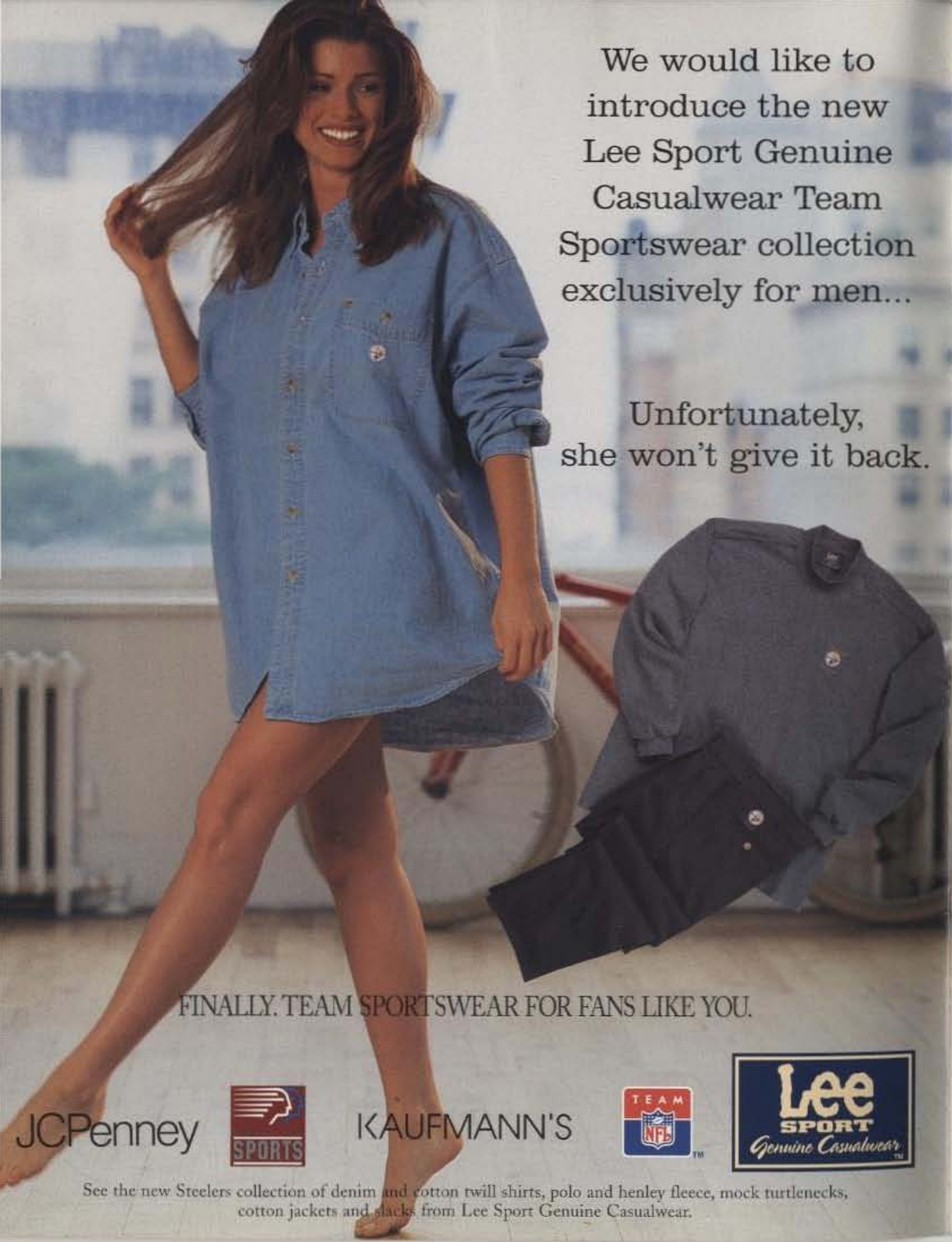

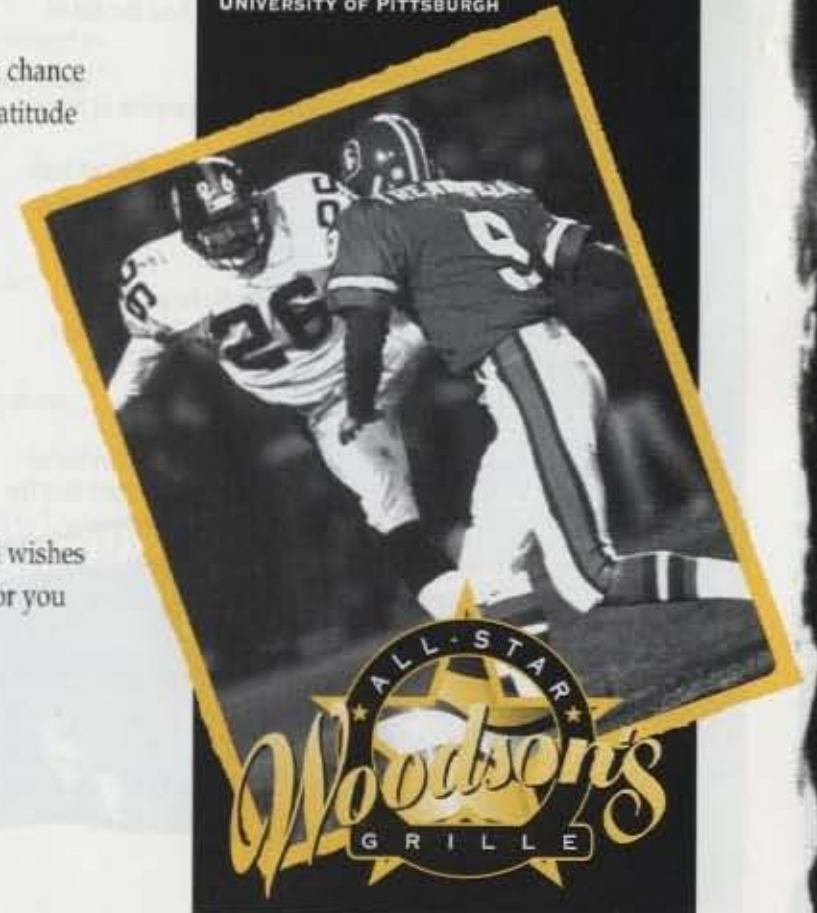

THE CORNERSTONE OF CORNERBACKS

Rod Woodson



To some people, Rod Woodson is scary. Very scary. Not to those who sit with him on the board of the local Leukemia Society. Not to his wife, Nicki, son Demetrius or daughters Marika and Tia with whom he lives quietly in Wexford. And not to his teammates on the Pittsburgh Steelers.

The people Rod Woodson scares are the ones who line up across from him every Sunday during the NFL season. And they're scared for a good reason. They're scared because

Rod brings a certain intensity to the game. In a physical game, he is a very physical player. With a rare combination of speed, size and strength not found in most cornerbacks.

And it is just this rare talent that has made him, in the minds of Steelers fans, sportswriters and armchair quarterbacks everywhere, the greatest cornerback to ever play the game of professional football. But in his own mind, Rod is just a regular guy who once told a reporter for The Journal Gazette, "I never thought in my wildest dreams I would play in the NFL."

But those wildest dreams kept coming true for Rod. And the list of achievements seems to go on forever.

High School: Football All-American, twice State Champion in track.

College: Football All-American at Purdue, as a senior he played both offense and defense against Indiana and is credited with destroying them almost single-handedly.

Joined the Pittsburgh Steelers as a first round draft choice in 1987. Selected to six consecutive Pro Bowls. All-Pro twice. Named most valuable defensive player in the NFL. Named to the NFL 75th Anniversary team.

Every year seems to get better and better for Rod. And that includes the opening of Rod Woodson's All-Star Grille. You can be sure that the same commitment to excellence that's made his football career so great goes into every dish we serve.

Milestones of the Dynasty

It all started in the 30's when the Pirates, as they were known then, played at Forbes Field. Renamed the Steelers in 1941, they moved to the newly completed Three Rivers Stadium in 1970 and Terry Bradshaw led the team to a 5-9 record, setting the stage for the Steelers to become the "team of the decade."

1972 - The year of rookie Franco Harris and the "Immaculate Reception." Also the year the Steelers won their first division title with an 11-3 record.

1974 - The Steelers' first Super Bowl Championship. A year remembered for rookie Lynn Swan and the Steel Curtain defense. In Super Bowl IX, Harris rushed for a record 158 yards and the Steelers won 16-6.

1975 - After an early loss to Buffalo, the Steelers won 11 straight games. Facing Dallas in the Super Bowl, Pittsburgh defeated the Cowboys 21-17.

1976 - The Steelers take their fourth straight division crown. The defense didn't allow a touchdown for 22 quarters and racked up three shutouts.

1977 - The Steelers won still another division title. Their fifth straight.

1978 - The Steelers showed the world what they were made of by becoming the first team in history to win three Super Bowls by beating Dallas 35-31.

1979 - Once again the Steelers astounded the entire country by winning their fourth Super Bowl, thrashing the Rams 31-19. Bradshaw picked up his 2nd Super Bowl MVP title, and Harris tied Jim Brown's record with his 7th 1,000 yard season.



THE YEAR IN REVIEW

1995 AFC Champions

WHAT A SEASON, WHAT A YEAR IT WAS.

The Pittsburgh Steelers have treated their fans to the gamut of emotions during and leading up to the 1995 NFL season. The fans felt frustration during free agency, but they learned their fears were unfounded once the season began. Then there was the disappointment of a loss to expansion Jacksonville, followed by the glee of an eight-game winning streak, and ultimately the euphoria of having the AFC Championship game at Three Rivers Stadium for the second consecutive January.

In an attempt to re-live many of the special moments that made up the past 12 months, here is a look at the Steelers' year in review.

JULY 17: Training camp opens. Cowher says, "I feel good about it. There's a good nucleus on this team."

JULY 18: Figures jogs. Obviously, the early predictions he'll miss the entire season aren't true.

JULY 22: Jim Miller has been outstanding. Keeping four quarterbacks is the hot topic.

JULY 27: Neil O'Donnell is looking very sharp, and he says, "I think we're starting to get a little rhythm going."

JULY 30: Figures is ahead of schedule. Cowher says he could be back for the season opener.

AUG 1: It's the hottest training camp in memory. The heat index is 102, and 200 gallons of water are consumed at the afternoon practice.

AUG. 2: Green runs his mouth. He calls Tom Donahoe "a high school coach"; he says O'Donnell "panicked" in the AFC Championship. Since Green is nursing an injury and not practicing, his mouth is the only thing running.

AUG. 4: The Steelers rip Buffalo, 31-10, but this meeting doesn't count. The one in January will.

AUG. 5: A newspaper headline reads, "Can Pittsburgh afford to keep four quarterbacks?"

AUG. 6: NBC broadcaster Cris Collinsworth, enchanted with off-season work of Art Modell, says during a preseason telecast, "Everything the Browns have done is to compete with the Steelers, who choked going to the Super Bowl."

AUG. 13: The preseason game versus Green Bay is costly. Kevin Greene breaks his right hand; Greg Lloyd will be fined \$12,000 for a hit on Brett Favre.

AUG. 14: Greene promises to be ready for the opener.

AUG. 15: Lake and Levon Kirkland sign long-term deals. Yancey Thigpen already has done the same, and the Steelers are putting Foster's salary to good use.

AUG. 19: Now 1-2 in the preseason after losing to Tampa Bay, 20-7.

AUG. 20: The first mandatory roster cutdown passes without surprise, but the Steelers still need help at cornerback and placekicker.

AUG. 22: The Steelers solve one problem by signing Norm Johnson, who says, "This is a team going places."

AUG. 24: The Steelers complete a 1-3 preseason by losing to the Eagles, 16-6. Gary Anderson is 3-for-5.

AUG. 25: Mike Tomczak signs a contract extension.

AUG. 28: Foster is cut by Carolina. The Steelers get down to 53 players, and, ta-da, four of them are quarterbacks.

AUG. 30: Combating boredom, Kordell



Stewart helps out on the scout team at wide receiver. A "slash" is born.

SEPT. 3: The Steelers lose Rod Woodson to a torn ACL, they lose Neil O'Donnell to a broken hand, they lose Tomczak for a while but still rally to beat the Lions, 23-20.

SEPT. 5: Really confused about the

rules protecting quarterbacks, Cowher says, "If you find a clarification, let me know."

SEPT. 7: It is announced that Figures and Alvoid Mays will start at cornerback in the Houston game.

SEPT. 10: Chad Brown records three sacks, Andre Hastings returns a punt 72 yards for a touchdown, and the Steelers win in Houston 34-17.

SEPT. 18: Lloyd knocks Dan Marino out of the game; Willie Williams starts at cornerback for Figures; Tomczak throws two interceptions and the Steelers lose in Miami, 23-10, in a game called a preview of the AFC Championship.

SEPT. 19: O'Donnell starts throwing.

SEPT. 20: Woodson says he'll attempt a comeback for the playoffs.

SEPT. 21: Darren Perry signs a contract extension.

SEPT. 24: The Steelers lose to Minnesota, 44-24, to go to 2-2. But the game forever will be remembered for Cowher stuffing a Polaroid in referee Gordon McCarter's pocket. "I don't care what they do to me," says Cowher. The NFL fines him \$7,500.

SEPT. 25: A switch at halfback - Pegram for Morris - occurs.

OCT. 1: Revenge is sweet, or is it really revenge? Whatever, it's a win: 31-16 over San Diego.

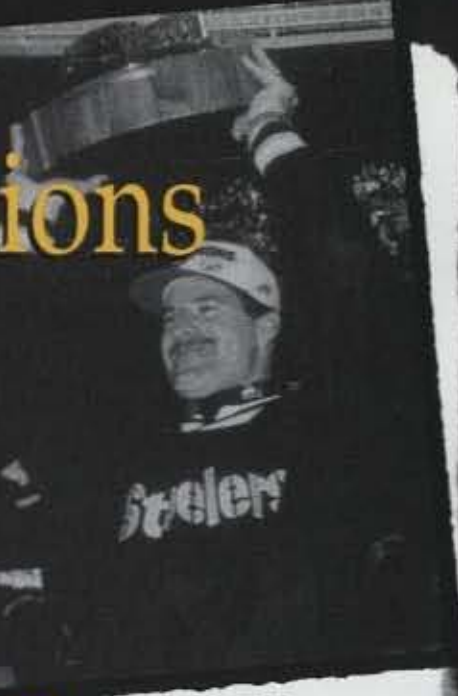
OCT. 2: After each got two interceptions and a touchdown against the Chargers, Williams and Mays are the toast of the town.

OCT. 3: It's stated that O'Donnell will start in Jacksonville.

OCT. 8: Red zone, red zone, red zone. The Steelers lose to the expansion Jaguars, 20-16. "I felt lower after the AFC Championship game," says Cowher. Steelers fans want O'Donnell's head on a plate.

OCT. 11: Stewart is a full-time wide receiver, for now.

OCT. 12: A dark cloud seems to be hanging over the Steelers. Ray Seals' cousin, Jonny Gammage, dies in an altercation with six cops. Those who know Gammage are shocked.



THE YEAR IN REVIEW, CONTINUED

OCT. 19: Cincinnati proves the loss to Jacksonville was no fluke by slapping the Steelers, 27-9. "The blame belongs right inside this room," says Perry. The fans comply, and no player escapes their wrath.

OCT. 22: Red zone, red zone, red zone, again. In their last 11 trips inside the 20-yard line, the Steelers have no touchdowns. O'Donnell: "We have to redo our whole red zone package."

OCT. 24: Cowher declares a nine-game season for the 3-4 Steelers. The media sees that as coach's rhetoric. John Jackson will have his knee scoped; Oliver Gibson breaks his hand.

OCT. 27: Jacksonville is talking playoffs.

OCT. 29: The Steelers, the real Steelers, are back in a 24-7 win over the Jaguars. Jeff Lagema: "They pushed us around pretty good." Dave Widell: "They didn't have their suntan lotion out like they did in Jacksonville."

OCT. 31: Cowher publicly defends Lloyd for a legal hit on Mark Brunell. The NFL has come to this?

NOV. 1: In Chicago, they are talking about home field advantage through the NFC playoffs for the 6-2 Bears.

NOV. 3: A Steelers wide receiver (Thigpen) is leading the AFC in yards.

NOV. 5: A huge win, a turnaround win, 37-34 in overtime in Chicago. Lloyd hugs O'Donnell, and a new team unity is cemented. Two in a row.

NOV. 8: After the move to Baltimore is announced, Art Modell tries a pep talk to spur the Browns. "We can make a statement to the whole country Monday night in Pittsburgh."

NOV. 10: Local radio stations implore Steeler fans to wear orange armbands to support Cleveland. Hub?

NOV. 13: It's the Steelers who make the statement by "slashing" the Browns, 20-3. Stewart is a rising star, and there's nary an orange armband in sight. Three in a row.

NOV. 15: The Bengals are talking playoffs.

NOV. 16: O'Donnell: "Nowadays, it's something special to stay with one team your whole career. Sure, I want to stay here."

NOV. 19: O'Donnell is 24-of-31 for 377 yards with three touchdowns; Morris rushes for 101 yards; down 31-13, the Steelers wink 49-31, in Cincinnati. Four in a row. Steelers fans want to canonize him.

NOV. 21: Dan Rooney delivers a message when he says the current group of five receivers is the best in Steelers history.

NOV. 24: Norm Johnson is leading the conference in scoring as the Steelers head to Cleveland for the last time.

NOV. 26: The 20-17 win in Cleveland is so sweet. Stewart is phenomenal because of his big plays, but the Steelers run out the last nine minutes of the game. Five in a row. Wonder what Collinsworth thinks of those big off-season moves now.

NOV. 28: Lloyd on the poor start: "Guys were more concerned about cellular phones and pagers. It was a distraction." It ceased to be after a players-only meeting in which Lloyd, Woodson and John L. Williams spoke.

DEC. 1: Houston is talking playoffs.

DEC. 2: The same people who were saying to get rid of O'Donnell in October now are pleading for him to be re-signed. Money is no object, especially since it isn't theirs.

DEC. 4: Winning the division is ho-hum. Lake: "We've been here before. We have a long way to go."

DEC. 6: Woodson is running on a treadmill.

DEC. 7: The Raiders are talking playoffs.

DEC. 10: The Steelers win in Oakland, 29-10, with Pegram rushing for 122 yards, Williams grabbing two interceptions and Ernie Mills scoring two touchdowns. Buckner on Al Davis' favorite team: "Mystique, my

butt." Seven in a row.

DEC. 12: New England isn't talking playoffs, but the Steelers are talking first-round bye.

DEC. 14: Aloha! Lloyd, Lake, Thigpen and Dermontti Dawson are voted to the Pro Bowl. Seats deserved more consideration.

DEC. 16: It's 27-27 with two minutes left, but the Steelers explode for 14 quick points to defeat the Patriots. Eight in a row.

DEC. 18: The Steelers will play in Green Bay without Pegram, Morris or John L., all injured.

DEC. 24: Despite the injuries and playing a team on the road that's desperate to win, the Steelers come close before losing to the Packers, 24-19, when Thigpen drops a ball in the end zone.

DEC. 26: Lloyd and Dawson named first-team All-Pro.

DEC. 27: O'Donnell is hugged by his teammates; he is voted the Steelers MVP, and he is the first quarterback so honored since Terry Bradshaw in 1978.

DEC. 28: Greene says he doesn't expect to be back in 1996.

DEC. 30: The Steelers will play Buffalo in the playoffs, because the Bills humiliated Miami in a wild card game. This time, it counts.

DEC. 31: Where all the people who picked the Dolphins to win the Super Bowl? Eric Green is noticeably silent.

JAN. 1: Brown will return after missing the last five games with a sprained ankle.

JAN. 2: The Bills' Jim Jeffcoat: "I really don't think they've felt a pass rush like we have."

JAN. 3: O'Donnell: "All I need is 2.8 seconds."

JAN. 6: Bruce Smith is in a hospital bed with a 103-degree fever; but the Steelers execute their typical game plan against the Bills: get physical. Thurman Thomas and Jim Kelly both leave temporarily with injuries; Bam Morris rushes for 106 yards and scores

twice; but four different Steelers wide receivers make huge plays at various times in a 40-21 win. Maybe Rooney was right.

JAN. 8: Ready for this? A writer from *The Daily News* in New York, in a column appearing in the Pittsburgh Post-Gazette, refers to Steelers fans as bozos and rips them for throwing a gold bagel at a Browns player after the playoff game last year. Has this guy ever been to Giants Stadium? Does

he get cable? Can he spell i-c-e-b-a-l-l?

JAN. 9: The Steelers locker room is a boring place. No planning of rap videos. No predictions. No bluster. No talking. Boring but businesslike.

JAN. 12: A light snow is falling and stadium crews are working feverishly to prepare the facility for the game. The field is clear and covered, and Woodson is making progress. All is ready for kickoff of the AFC Championship game.

And the rest is history.

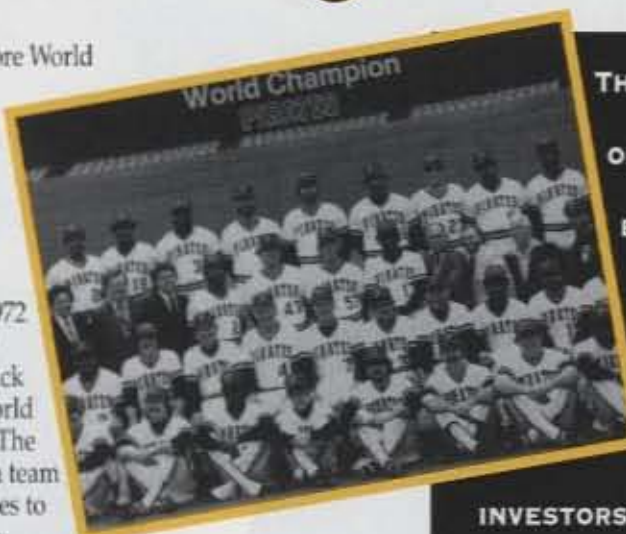

The Pittsburgh Pirates

The Pirates captured two more World Championships during the 1970s. Their 1971 victory over Baltimore was a showcase for Clemente who batted .414 and received the Series MVP award. However, Clemente's career came to a tragic end, New Year's Day, 1972 when he was killed in a plane crash. But the Pirates came back in 1979 to repeat their 1925 World Championship performance. The Pirates became only the fourth team in history to erase a three games to one deficit when they took the Orioles in seven games. Hall of Famer Willie Stargell lead the charge with a .400 batting average, three home runs and seven RBI's. For his efforts, he was named Series MVP.



Atlanta Braves have won more NL games than Pittsburgh during the '90s.

The people of Pittsburgh and the surrounding Tri-State area responded well to the club's success in the nineties as the Pirates drew in excess of two million fans in both 1990 and 1991. A crowd of 59,568 the largest ever to watch a professional baseball game in Pittsburgh, witnessed the 65th Major League Baseball All-Star Game, played at Three Rivers Stadium on July 12, 1994.

After several lean years in the mid-eighties, the Pirates returned to contention in 1988 when they finished in second place and broke the club's 28-year-old attendance mark.

Pittsburgh started the 1990's in fine fashion, winning the NL East title three straight years. Manager Jim Leyland took home NL Manager of the Year honors in both 1990 and 1992. Under the direction of Leyland only the

20 YEAR ANNIVERSARY

University of Pittsburgh

1976 National Championship

This fall, Pitt celebrated the 20th anniversary of its 1976 national championship football season.

On October 5, many of the players from that undefeated team were honored at halftime of the Pitt-Temple Homecoming game at Pitt Stadium.

The 1976 national championship was the ninth in Pitt's long, colorful history, and was the culmination and crowning achievement during the first Pitt coaching stint of Johnny Majors, who had arrived at Pitt in late 1972 when Pitt had just gone through its ninth consecutive losing season. But bolstered by an initial recruiting class which included Tony Dorsett, the foundation was built for future greatness.

1976 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS

Pitt's '76 season opened with a convincing 31-10 victory at Notre Dame on national television, and the regular season ended with a 24-7 victory against Penn State at Three Rivers Stadium. Pitt's first victory against the Nittany Lions in 11 years. In between, there were many memorable moments and personalities:

- Quarterbacks Robert Haygood and Matt Cavanaugh both being forced to the sidelines with injuries, and walk-on and former eight-stringer Tom Yewcic stepping under center and calmly guiding the Panthers to three straight victories
- Cavanaugh passing for five touchdowns in a victory at Duke
- Dorsett become college football's all-time leading rusher with a dramatic touchdown at Navy
- Safety Bob Jury picking off a school-record 10 interceptions for the season
- Placekicker Carson Long becoming the all-time kick-scoring leader in college football history
- Pitt's unheralded defensive line, led by Al Romano, Don Parrish and Randy Holloway, stuffing Syracuse on back-to-back plays late in the game, preserving the perfect record
- Dorsett winning the Heisman Trophy

The Panthers earned the national title by thoroughly dominating the Georgia Bulldogs, 27-3, at the Sugar Bowl in New Orleans. Cavanaugh was voted the game's Most Valuable Player, barely outpointing Dorsett, who rushed for a Sugar Bowl-record 202 yards.



HISTORICAL OVERVIEW

Pitt Football

Pitt's 106-year football history is filled with both team and individual achievement and glory.

Its nine national championships rank Pitt sixth in NCAA annals. The football program has produced 82 first-team All-Americans, and ranks sixth among Division I-A schools with 39 consensus All-Americans. Pitt players have won the Heisman Trophy, the Maxwell Award, the Walter Camp Award, the Outland Trophy, and the Lombardi Award.

Seventeen men associated with Pitt football – players and coaches – have been elected to the College Football Hall of Fame, and more are on their way.

Marshall Goldberg, Mike Ditka, Tony Dorsett, Joe Walton, Joe Schmidt, Mark May, Dan Marino and Bill Fralic are but a small sampling of some of the all-time football greats who have worn the Pitt Gold and Blue. Some of the college game's most successful coaches of all time, including Jock Sutherland, Pop Warner, Jackie Sherrill and Johnny Majors have roamed the sidelines at Pitt Stadium coaching the Panthers to greatness.

During its storied history, the Pitt football program has sent more than 200 players to the National Football League, and two former Panthers – Marty Schottenheimer (Kansas City Chiefs) and Dave Wannstedt (Chicago Bears) are now head coaches in the NFL. Wannstedt replaced another former Pitt man (Ditka) in Chicago.
